THE VICAR'S LETTER

My last letter was written at the time of the V.E. day celebrations, and by chance I am writing this over the weekend marking the 50th anniversary of V.J.day. This time the mood is rather more sombre, partly because we've just been reminded of the horror of Hiroshima and Magasaki, and also I think because inter-views with ex-prisoners of the Japanese revived memories of what they were made to suffer, and doubts as to whether modern Japan is still ready to acknowledge it. At our united service some reminiscences of a survivor were read which brought vividly to life both the ordeal he and his comrades went through, and their incredulous joy when they heard on a claudestine radio that the war was over. He ended with some words from the old version of Psalm 126: "When the Lord turned the captivity of Zion, then were we like unto them that dream; then was our mouth filled with laughter and our tongue with joy". But as I read those lines I could hear on the radio accounts of refugees in flight and atrocities committed in Bosnia and Central Africa, raising the age-old question, "When will they ever learn?" One who did learn was Bishop Leonard Wilson of Singapore, (a cousin, as it happens, of Mrs Kathleen Jones, White House) who under torture by the Japanese was reminded "by the grace of God", he said later, of the communion hymn "Look, Father, look, on his anointed face, and only look on us as found in him", and was able to see his tormentors "not as they were, but as they were capable of becoming, redeemed by the power of Christ" and to forgive them. Jesus once compared himself to grain of wheat which must fall to the ground and seem to die to produce a harvest of new life. As the children's hymn says "He died that we might be forgiven", and it is only when we understand that that "we" includes everyone whom we are tempted to divide into "us" and "them" that we will begin to learn the lesson which will heal the world's wounds and reap a harvest of peace and gladness for all to share. In the last words of the same psalm the prisoner quoted "He who goes out weeping, carrying seed to sow, will return with songs of joy, bringing home the sheaves

VOCATION - A LAY WOMAN WRITES AN ARTICLE FOR THE PARISH MAGAZINE:

The week after the Church of England voted to ordain women to the priesthood, a friend asked me if I would now be thinking about "going into the Church". Although I can now dismiss his ignorance of the Anglican Church, the ministry and myself, at the time I was aggravated to say the least. Perhaps, because the annoyance has stayed with me, it can serve as a reminder to those of us who value a lay ministry, just how difficult it is to explain the concept of ministry to those outside the Church and often also to those within.

Most people detest meetings, many of which are boring and seem not to lead to action. Ministry is like that - I have a 'calling' in the Church which is not about being ordained. That calling has led me into lots of committees and meetings, some of which seem to have been fruitless - but who knows what God can do with such? This calling has also led me into situations and responsibilities where a strong sense of ministry has been my experience. Perhaps the most onerous and certainly the most humbling of these, has been my years as a member and more recently Vice-Chair of the Provincial Selection Panel. How can the Church try with candidates for ordination to discern their vocation to the ordained Ministry without people bringing a breath of experience and an entirely different focus to the selection process. In talking and living for a few days with those who feel a call to be 'set apart' in the sacred ministry. we lay people are called to exercise our ministry differently - not as Deacons, Priests or Bishops, for that matter. That does not make our ministry less important. training for ministry as laity, but without us what of the ordained ministry? Collaborative ministry is the "in" term at present and the Church in Wales selection process could be used as an ideal example of collaboration.

My 'calling' has led me along many paths - very often off the main highway - provided many joys and some serious dissappointments. As a member of a Parish with only a small congregation and as a Reader, I have perhaps had a more prominent lay ministry within the worship of the Church, than is open to some, but surely the real test of calling is in the community in which we function, whether in terms of residing, working or pursuing any other activity. Do the people we meet know at the end of the contact that we are Succeeding or failing in whatever task we are undertaking, reflective of our ministry?

The most important question for me is about partnership with the 'ordained' ministry, both recognising the God-given gifts of the other and working together, supporting each other in the true ministry which is the responsibility of all baptised members of the Church.
