On Saturday 22 September a quarter peal was rung on the bells of St Silin's to commemorate the retirement of the vicar and recognise his great support for getting the bells going again in Llansilin

The quarter peal consisted of 1400 changes of Doubles (ie on 5 bells with tenor behind) using 1 principle (Stedman) and 3 methods (Reverse Canterbury, Plain Bob and Grandsire)

With the bells ringing by our own band of ringers, we made our way to church for the Evensong farewell service of our vicar. On entering the church, we were welcomed by four very artistic displays, with flower arrangements depicting some of the vicar's many interests – morris dancing, books and birds, bell ringing and quizzes, including the famous black chair! The church was well attended and the congregation rose as the Revd. Kit Carter came in, accompanied by his friend, the Revd. Glyn Morgan. Hymns, readings and prayers were personally chosen, with special significance for his ministry of 40 years. Deborah Hill-Trevor read a lesson and Morfudd Williams accompanied the singing on the piano as the organ is out of use while the building

work is going on. The collection was taken by the church wardens, Esther Milner and Mary Morris, and light refreshments were served after a moving and memorable service.

## **CHURCH ARCHIVE RESTORATION**

The church has a most interesting big record book, in which, since 1917, a succession of secretaries has written an account of each year at St Silin's. Not surprisingly, after 88 years, it is starting to show signs of wear and actual damage.

Since there are enough pages for a further 50 years of secretaries' entries, it has been taken to Oswestry's very own bookbinder, George Miller, for repair. He has made a wonderful job of strengthening the spine, re-covering the outer covers in half natural hide, replacing the original marbled end papers and the original 1917 leather label.

Further generations of secretaries can now add St Silin's annual reports right up until the 2050's, making it a valuable and interesting record covering some 140 years!

## **PARISH ROOM PROJECT**

The PCC has received many favourable comments about the quality of the stonework on the new extension and first reports suggest that the window frames and door frames continue the excellence. At the time of writing the new heating system is connected to the pipework in the church and is ready for commissioning and testing. We hope to have heating back on in the church very soon! The re-arrangements of the pews has also been done, so another milestone reached. Some aspects of the project have been undertaken by our own willing volunteers – what would we do without them?

Shortly we shall see the construction of the doorway between church and extension, completion of the plastering and, when the building has dried out and the timber acclimatised, installation of the oak flooring.

Unfortunately, progress has not been quite as rapid as initially hoped and, as a result, the PCC has decided to hold the official opening early in 2006, rather than this autumn. Much of the planning for this event has been completed. We can look forward to a memorable occasion, as well as having a new resource of great quality available to the whole community.

## LLANSILIN COMMUNITY COUNCIL

The September meeting was presided over by the Chairman, Cllr D W Davies, assisted by the clerk, Mr H Hughes, who reported that the Highway Authority had agreed to provide village name signs in Cefn Canol and to replace the missing "Bend" sign. Improvements were scheduled to be implemented regarding water on roads near Hafod, Rhiwlas and Tynycelyn, Llansilin.

A response from Shropshire County NHS outlined the procedures when Shrop Doc is contacted in times of emergency, but this did not appear to address matters of local concern.

The following planning applications were supported:

- ◆ erection of garage and porch at 8 Bryn Dentyr
- ◆ erection of dwelling and conversion of existing barn to garage at land at the rear of Ty Croes

Correspondence received included: Cymdeithas Tai Clwyd annual report; Society of Local Council Clerks notification of 31<sup>st</sup> annual conference; PAVO local action group for over 50's and request for information regarding local newsletters; Shropshire County Council and Oswestry Borough relating to the draft statement of community involvement in the local development framework; Montgomeryshire Community Health Council suggesting there should only be one Community Health Council in Powys; Shropshire Fire and Rescue Service proposed changes; Powys County Council notice of liaison meetings with Town and Community Councils.

Following the recent agreement to be responsible for the administration of the public conveniences in Llansilin, it was agreed that these should remain open during the winter months of 2005-6.

Concerns were expressed regarding the future funding of village halls in Powys and proposals that Town and Community Councils should part fund them. It was reported that a meeting between hall representatives and a county council officer had been convened on 15 September to discuss the matter.

The clerk was asked to report the following complaints:

- ◆ Pot hole by Rossett
- ◆ Uneven surface of road to Tyddyn Cynar
- ◆ Damaged manhole near Memorial Hall
- ◆ Overgrown hedge near Lledrode
- ◆ Mirror at the top of the village needs re-aligning
- ◆ Damaged "Stop" sign near the Old Hand inn

## PREMIERE OF "CHRONICLE OF CYNLLAITH"

The premiere of the film of the "Chronicle of Cynllaith" was shown in the village hall on Saturday, 22 October to a packed audience. Chris Burton had spent weeks editing the 24 hours of film footage and the end result was enthusiastically received by everyone there. It was also a good opportunity for a reunion of cast and crew.



## MORE GOOD NEWS FROM ST CADWALADR'S

Friends of St Cadwaladr's are most grateful to Mr Richard Pugh, Ty Gwyn, for so kindly paying for the restoration of the vestry window. Time and the prevailing west winds really had taken their toll, some of the small pieces of glass were broken or missing and all the many panes have had to be re-set in the cast iron frame. The window is now in splendid condition and ready to face the winter gales.



The stone work surrounding the window is one of the few remaining features of the earlier building which survived the rigorous restoration of 1883. It was during that phase that the gallery at the west end was removed, no trace of it now remaining.

The next project will be to find a considerable sum of money for the re-roofing – the oak pegs holding the slates are giving way. Routine maintenance is keeping the rain at bay, but the job will have to be faced in due course.

The church was beautifully decorated for the Harvest Service, led by the Revd Paul West of Kinnerley. Services will continue and will be taken by a rota of visiting Ministers. The churchwarden is Vera Evans and she can be contacted on 791471.
