

My Dear Friends

Thank you so much for your warm welcome as both Kathleen and I settle in this beautiful area with its lovely people. The Tanat Valley has so much to offer and I hope that lots of visitors take on the new Living Stones Heritage Trail and I'm sure many of you will join us in the special attractions at St Silin's at the end of August as part of the Llansilin Show. We're beginning to be at home in the vicarage and slowly making an impression on the jungle outside, not so many tall trees now, but plenty of wood for the winter ahead! I hope we don't need so much though.

I hope that I will meet many of you in my ministry and you need to know a little more about your new vicar. I was ordained at the tender age of 50 in 1990, a novel experience for Kathleen who married a bus conductor in 1963 (I worked for Crosville Motor Company). Before that I had been an apprentice at De Havilland in Broughton and worked on the Comet IV amongst others. But I was a hopeless fitter, my hands wouldn't do as they were told, hence the job on the buses. I became a postman for two years and then a papermaking assistant. Papermaking is one of the oldest professions in the world, not the oldest, that belongs to GPs (God told Moses to keep taking the tablets!) Then I worked at Shell Stanlow as a Chemical Process Operator for 12 years. From 1983 to 1985 I had additional responsibilities as a Shop Steward in the T & G, 6/420 branch at a time of great upheaval in industry and Trade Union history. In 1985 I took Voluntary Severance, a posh way of being made redundant and spent 4 years on the dole. But God, in his wisdom, had it all planned and it all worked for good and I ended up a minister (but that's another story). I retired in 2006 from a parish in Lancashire with a challenging combination of a big council estate (overspill from Liverpool) and a rather more upmarket area. Before that I worked in South Wales where I had the good fortune to have Rowan Williams as my Bishop.

Likes and dislikes? Kathleen and I both love being in the garden and growing our own, there's something good about being involved in creation and the food tastes so much better. I hate labels when they are put on people. They restrict, we're meant to be free. Having said that, I'm a member of the Christian Socialist Movement and Wing Padre for Merseyside Wing, Air Cadets Organization.

Well that's enough of us, my vision for Llansilin and the Church? I would love to see Church/Community ties which are already strong, to be developed. The village shop I see as being in that great tradition of cooperation to meet a need, it's wonderful, the Cooperative Movement started in a shop in Rochdale in 1851. I'll join in, indeed enjoy community life generally and have a good time with you and we both look forward to gracious encounters with you.

Welcome to our New Vicar and his Wife





Christian Aid Sunday – A good number attended the service at Rhiwlas Chapel and Alun Jones, Llangadfan, gave us a timely sermon and, in accordance with his message, he donated his cheque to Christian Aid.

Good Will Message Sunday – This is the week that the Youth of Wales send a Good Will Message to the Youth of the World. The young people of the chapels led the service which was held at Cefn Canol. In June we had a service which was led by the men, the theme being "This Book." Both services were organised by the Reverend Stanton Evans.

This year the Reverend Dr Nerys Tudor was the visiting preacher at the Rhiwlas Preaching Festival, and, as usual, the tea served between the two services was mouth-watering.

**CÔR GODRE'R ARAN IN CONCERT
AT LLANSILIN MEMORIAL HALL
Saturday, 25 September 2010 7.30 pm**

Since its inception the highly acclaimed Welsh male voice choir Côr Godre'r Aran, based in the village of Llanuwchllyn at the western end of Llyn Tegid (Lake Bala), has regularly entertained audiences all over Wales and at many principal venues in England including The Royal Albert Hall, The Globe Theatre, The Sage and Birmingham Symphony Hall. Concert tours have taken them to Scotland, Ireland and Portugal and extended international tours include three visits to Canada/U.S.A., and eight tours of Australia with visits to New Zealand, Tasmania, Hong Kong, Argentina and Singapore. Over the years Côr Godre'r Aran has successfully

competed at National and International levels and won principal awards at the National Eisteddfod of Wales and four male voice championships at the International Eisteddfod at Llangollen. In 2005 the Choir won the BBC Radio Cymru competition for Male Voice Choirs.

The choir's gifted conductor, Eirian Owen, was appointed accompanist in 1970 and, subsequently, unanimously elected as musical director to succeed Tom Jones in 1975. Over the years she has voluntarily devoted literally thousands of hours to the Choir and was instrumental in developing and directing it to its ultimate and continuing success. She has served many years on the panel of official accompanists at the National Eisteddfod of Wales and the Llangollen International Eisteddfod. She has accompanied most of the current generation of prominent Welsh soloists featuring in the world of international opera. Eirian was Chorus Master of the 1997 National Eisteddfod Choir and that role was repeated when the Eisteddfod returned to Bala in 2009. In 1998 she was Guest Conductor of New Zealand's National Festival of Male Voice Choirs at a massed concert in Wellington. During 2003 she presented two series of programmes of classical music on BBC Radio Cymru. In January 2005 she was awarded an honorary MA degree by the University of Wales in recognition of her distinguished service to music.

The Management Committee of Neuadd Goffa Llansilin Memorial Hall is, therefore, delighted that such a prestigious choir and conductor have agreed to give the Annual Concert at the hall on Saturday, 25 September 2010 at 7:30 pm. LLANSILIN COMMUNITY COUNCIL


At the annual general meeting Cllr Dennis Sockett was elected chairman for the ensuing year. He thanked members for the honour conferred on him and paid tribute to the excellent manner in which his predecessor, Cllr J M Jones, had led the council. Cllr Mrs Marjorie Evans was elected vice chairman. The following committee appointments were made: Planning Sub, chairman, vice chairman and Cllr P Lovell; One Voice Wales Cllrs E O Evans and J M Jones; Youth Club Cllr E O Evans and County Cllr A Davies. Planning applications supported included single storey extension at Cae Canol, Cefn Canol; extension to agricultural building in Priddbwl Mawr; two storey extension at Moelygwelltyn Ucha (revised application). The clerk was appointed to represent the council at an inaugural meeting regarding local housing needs to be convened by the Rural Housing Enabler. Members agreed to fund the summer edition of the Llansilin Newsletter. The clerk was asked to report the numerous potholes on the road from Bwlchydongau to Tynfron turning. County Cllr Davies agreed to make enquiries regarding the proposed improvements to the crossroads south of Llansilin and the provision of double lines in Llansilin.

The July meeting was chaired by Cllr D Sockett and supported by the Clerk, H Hughes, who reported on meetings he had attended relating to code of conduct and affordable housing. County Cllr A Davies presented maps relating to the proposed provision of double yellow lines in Llansilin. These appeared to deviate considerably from the proposals already approved by the Council. Cllr Davies agreed to approach the officer concerned with a view to him meeting councillors on site. The following planning applications were supported: listed building consent for installation of a log burning flue at Darwin Cottage and erection of an agricultural building and construction of hard standing (retrospective) at Priddbwl Mawr. The planning sub committee had met in June and supported two planning applications at Glashirfryn Cymdu. The statement of accounts for 2009/10 was presented and approved. It was agreed that a letter of thanks be sent to the internal auditor, Mr Arthur James. Correspondence received included the Boundary commission's review of electoral arrangements in Powys (fortunately the Llanrhaeadr/Llansilin ward would not be affected), One Voice Wales, details of training for councillors, Powys CC statement of licensing policy and also details of secondary and post-16 education modernisation programme, Welsh assembly local authority's byelaws in Wales, Ombudsman's Annual Report of Public Services. Two applications for financial assistance were left on the table. Complaints received included high hedge in front of 1 Maesyllan, which affects visibility and access on to the public highway, unsatisfactory work carried out on open ditch in Cefn Canol, uneven surface on road near Peniarth. Cllr Davies agreed to report the defective light in Cefn Canol.



Everyone will have particular memories of this year's Christian Aid Week. For many it will be the happy memory of a successful social evening held in the Institute. For others it will be responding to a knock on the door. For some it will be feeling footsore at the end of delivering and collecting envelopes. Yet common to those memories will be the illustrated talk given by Anna Jane Evans at the Institute and the inspiring address by Alun Jones at the united service in Bethania.

Anna's audience was shocked to learn of the dreadful conditions prevailing in a suburb of Nairobi. Here were people with ambition – ambition to secure water supply that would allow adequate sewerage, laundry and personal hygiene. Christian Aid helped that ambition. Among other things a shower block had been provided but charges were made for its use. Money raised was used to provide further blocks. While there is still much to do people had been put in a position to help themselves and each other.
