FROM THE VICAR

Dear Parishioners,

People get quite excited about the way in which the Tanat Valley Mission Area has been brought in. It was quite striking. I was asked if we could have a joint service of the Mission Area at St Cadwaladr's in January. I was concerned. Would there be enough room for contingents from Penybont Fawr, Llanrhaeadr and the rest? Often we are quite short of space when we have our own joint service in that little church. As it happened I need not have worried. The service was as lovely as usual. The children sang and read. We celebrated the communion. But there were hardly any people from the rest of the mission area. People are voting with their feet.

People are, of course, resistant to change. I think it is exaggerated nevertheless. What we must do now as in time past is to concentrate on our own parish church. 'It's no longer a parish church,' you say. 'The Mission Area is the parish.' But St Cedwyn's, St Silin's, St Cadwaladr's are churches within the parish nevertheless. Let us respect and love them. And then? We've also always been concerned about the big world outside.

There are two aspects to it. In practical terms we look after the wellbeing of our own parish church. Where else do we go when there's a christening, a marriage or a funeral? People worry about the money. Believe me, we shouldn't. Whatever you donate will go where it is intended. But the community at large is going through a period of disbelief. The old certainties are questioned as never before, in religion, in politics, in much else. For that perhaps we also need each other as never before. That is why the Mission Area has been set up.

Will it help? Whatever else, I think, there will be problems on the way. It requires patience, certainly. But our shared values are greater than our differences, made apparent in particular on 16th April this year when again we contemplate that empty tomb at Golgotha in a garden full of spring flowers, in themselves a sign of new life.

So what do we do about it? Start off by coming to St Silin's parish room every Wednesday at 6 p.m. during Lent where we will look again at

St Mark's Gospel. We hear the lessons read in church, but the lessons give us no idea of context, nor of St Mark's intentions as he began, the first gospel writer, the inventor of the genre.

Church news

The mission link

You won't have noticed any difference – which is a good thing – but we are now part of the Tanat Valley Mission Area. It's best described as a sort of super-parish and although it has oversight of the former parishes we have effectively retained most of our powers, though the names have changed. We also retain effective control of our own financial resources, including the benefits of Gift Aid.

Representatives of all the churches are on the Mission Area Conference, which is the super-PCC, and two of our own church wardens, Jeffrey Olstead from Llansilin and Peter Morris from Llangedwyn are the co-chairmen, so our voice will not be lost.

Voices of a different kind may be coming to St Silin's. The cathedral choir at St Asaph has no endowment so there is a fund-raising campaign to provide financial security. Among the potential events is a concert here in St Silin's, so be prepared to make a diary date.

Raising Owain's banner

It was a result of Owain Glyndŵr's mission that our original stone church was burnt to the ground, but, to show that we've forgiven him, he now hangs in the parish room. Well, a very splendid banner portraying him does. It is hoped that the banner will take pride of place in the north aisle heritage centre when that project is completed. It was produced by the Llansilin craft group and based on an original painting by Mary Cunnah. It has been



universally admired – especially his magnificent beard, hung well out of reach of mice.

Light fantastic

The Crown of Light which adorns St Silin's tower over Christmastide raised £480 in gifts this year. The money will be split between Hope House and the Severn Hospice. Many thanks to all who gave so generously.

Lent course

The Lent course this year will examine the background to St Mark's gospel. It begins on Wednesday 8 March and will be held on every subsequent Wednesday until Easter. Led by the vicar, it will take place in the parish room, starting at 6.00 pm.

Can you manage money?

After 16 years of sterling service Graham Moss is retiring as PCC treasurer, so we need a replacement. The job has been made simpler by the introduction of a computer package and Graham will continue to manage Gift Aid and provide support to the new treasurer as they learn about the job. Llansilin WI folds after 93 years

2016 came to a sad end when it was decided to close Llansilin WI after 93 years of the W14omen's Institute in the village. 14The WI began here in 1923 with 19 members. It has fluctuated over the years, reaching a high point of 50 members. But that had now declined to just seven who took the very difficult decision that the branch was no longer viable.

The WI used to meet monthly in the village institute and always looked forward to hearing interesting talks, learning new skills and meeting up with friends. There were many outings and visits to interesting places that were all much enjoyed. It was a wonderful way of meeting like-minded people and Llansilin will greatly miss the WI after all these years but it is hoped that another group of ladies might take over where the WI left off.
